- A. Virginia Beach MEDAC Chair, RADM (Ret.) Phil Olson welcomed everyone and thanked Norfolk and Portsmouth MEDAC for joining the joint meeting in Virginia Beach.
- B. Members and guests' introductions
- **I. Approval of 27 November 2023 MEDAC Joint Meeting notes** Provided via email. The minutes were approved unanimously.
- **II. Guest Presentation** IV. A was moved up to allow ample time for Project Director Ryan Banas to leave the meeting earlier than scheduled. (IV. A to III.A.)
 - A. Project Director Ryan Banas shared a Presentation on the Hampton Roads Bridge-Tunnel Expansion Project.

- **III. HRMFFA Update** Rick Dwyer, Executive Director of HRMFFA (moved from III to IV.)
 - A. The House released its draft FY25 849.8-billion-dollar budget last week.
 - B. There is 31.5 billion for the construction of 6 new ships.
 - C. Cut procurement of F35s from 68 to 58.
- **IV. Economic Development Updates Norfolk, Portsmouth, and Virginia Beach** (moved from IV to V)
 - A. Norfolk Economic Development continues to support the existing businesses Mike Paris
 - about six projects are expanding ranging from cold storage to logistics
 - \$57 million investment and about 200 jobs
 - \$1.2 million in grants that mainly focused on 35th Street in the Riverview area

- City Council allocated \$500,000 to our commercial corridors
- We continue to work with our Military Affairs
- B. Portsmouth Economic Development Brian Donahue
 - The maritime industrial base is strong
 - A longtime Company headquartered in Portsmouth now manufacturing aircraft carrier and submarine hull sections
 - Exciting work on Wavy Street over #20 million investments supporting over 200 new jobs in the last two years
 - International interests in the city for example a Trilateral AUKUS (Australia, United Kingdom, and United States) Agreement to provide fleet to the Australian Navy.
 - Bill's Marine Ship Repair expanded to Portsmouth giving them a second campus and one of 2 black-owned ship building companies.
 - JRF, a Hispanic-owned company, is the other ship repair company that expanded in Portsmouth.
 - The very large vessel Orion is on the waterfront now with endeavors with the Offshore Wind Project.
- C. Virginia Beach Economic Development Charlie Bauman
 - City of Virginia Beach was the presenting sponsor in the 2024 Hampton Roads Global Commerce Council State of the Port and will be hosting again in 2025.
 - This created a large economic impact for the area.
