# **SMALL BUSINESS GRANTS & LOANS**

#### <u>Virginia Minority Business</u> <u>Development Agency</u>

Funded by the U.S. Department of Commerce, Minority Business Development Agency, they help Minority Business Entrepreneurs gain greater access to contracts/markets/capital in the Federal/State/Local/Commercial space. They deliver strategic business consulting, technical assistance & work to understand your capabilities to develop near & long-term strategic growth.

#### <u>Amazon Black Business</u> <u>Accelerator</u>

Grow your business with dedicated resources, financial assistance, business education & coaching, and marketing & advertising support.

### <u> 37 Angels</u>

37 angels is an organization made up of female angel investors that invest in womenowned small businesses. The organization recognizes the disadvantages that female entrepreneurs face in the loan market and seeks to close that gap. To help women keep their companies afloat, 37 Angels offers grants as large as \$150,000.

### <u>Virginia Beach Community</u> <u>Organization Grant</u>

### <u>Walmart Local Community</u> <u>Grants</u>

Local Community grants are awarded through an open application process and provide funding directly from Walmart and Sam's Club facilities to local organizations in the U.S. Local Community grants range from a minimum of \$250 to a maximum of \$5,000. The Community Organization Grant (COG) program provides an opportunity for qualified nonprofit organizations that deliver services to Virginia Beach residents to receive funding from the City. The City Council-appointed COG Review and Allocation Committee evaluates applications and determines how best to allocate funds among the organizations.

### **SBA Microloans**

These government-backed loans of up to \$50,000 can be a good choice for new or very small businesses. They're typically issued by nonprofit community financial institutions, many of which offer additional training and resources.

# **SMALL BUSINESS GRANTS & LOANS**

#### <u>National Association for the Self-Employed</u> <u>Growth Grants</u>

This nonprofit trade association provides educational resources and grants for small businesses and entrepreneurs. To apply for a grant of yo to \$4,000, you'll need to become an active member of the association, provide a detailed explanation of how you'll use the funds, show how the grant will support your business growth and provide supporting documentation.

### **Accion Opportunity Fund**

Accion Opportunity Fund is a financial support system for small businesses that advances racial, gender, and economic justice for all. Take a look at the small business progress loan.

### Virginia SBDC Funding Resources

The SBDC offers information and resources on federal, state and local loan programs, tax incentives, and other financial resources available to both established small businesses and startups.

### Small Business Innovation Research <u>Program</u>

The Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) program strengthens opportunities for innovative small businesses using federally funded research. The program stimulates technological innovation, uses small businesses to meet federal research needs, and enables participation by socially and economically disadvantaged businesses.

### **Fast Break for Small Business**

150 small businesses will receive \$10,000 grants and a LegalZoom product of their choosing, valued up to \$500. 3,000 emerging entrepreneurs who haven't yet launched their intended business will receive a LegalZoom product of their choosing, valued at up to \$500.

# **SMALL BUSINESS GRANTS & LOANS**

#### Community Business Partnership (CBP)

The CBP serves startups and existing small business owners including women, veterans, and minorities primarily located in the DMV Metropolitan region. The business owners we serve are across most business sectors and have a wide range of financial positions. However, we focus on supporting microenterprises that are underbanked and underserved in our community.

#### <u>Grants.gov</u>

Grants.gov is one of the first resources you may want to investigate for business grants both minority grants and other opportunities. The database, maintained by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB), contains information about more than 1,000 federal grants. It also includes details about the eligibility requirements for each program

To apply for a grant through the Grants.gov system, you'll need to first establish a Workspace account that you (and your team) use to access the system's applications. Once you complete this step, you'll be free to search for federal grants that align with your business goals and apply for those you believe are a good match for you.

### <u>Virginia Economic Development Incentive</u> <u>Grant (VEDIG)</u>

The Virginia Economic Development Incentive Grant program (VEDIG) assists and encourages companies to invest and create new employment opportunities by locating significant headquarters, administrative, or service sector operations in Virginia. There must be an active and realistic competition between Virginia and another state or country for attracting the project.

### <u>USDA Rural Business Development Grant</u> (<u>RBDG</u>)

Provides funding, training, and technical assistance to small rural businesses, with a typical award range of \$10,000-\$500,000 Rural Business Development Grants (RBDGs) support targeted technical assistance, training, and other activities that promote the development and expansion of small and emerging private businesses in rural areas. Eligible businesses must have fewer than 50 employees and less than \$1 million in gross annual revenues. RBDG funding is separated into either enterprise or opportunity-type grant activities.

# For Women Only SMALL BUSINESS GRANTS & LOANS

### The Amber Grant

This grant is for women only, and there is an award every month. This grant was founded after the untimely death of a young women named Amber. She passed before she could realize her dreams of starting a business.

### **Grantsforwomen.org**

Grants For Women helps small business owners find and research grant opportunities. The grants differ in scope, region, qualifying criteria, and amount, based on the institution offering them.

### IFundWomen Universal Grant

At IFundWomen, members have access to a variety of grants, from our monthly Pay-It-Forward crowdfunding grant to those from corporate partners like Visa, Unilever, Diageo, Vista, adidas, American Express, and more.

### **Backstage Capital**

Backstage invests in startup founders who identify as a Woman, Person of Color, and/or LGBTQ. They believe these founders are underestimated and have the most potential for unlocking innovation and creating valuable businesses. To support more founders, they're growing a global community of local accelerator programs.

### Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Schloarship

The Jane M. Klausman (JMK) Women in Business Scholarship program helps women pursue undergraduate and master's degrees in business management and overcome gender barriers from the classroom to the boardroom.

### **EmpowHER Grants**

Female small-business owners who are at least 22 years old may be eligible for an EmpowHER grant from Boundless Future Foundation. Your business must have been established within the last three years in order to be eligible. Grant funding is awarded as reimbursement of up to \$25,000 for business-related expenses.

### Minority and Women Farmers and Rancher Loans

Loans to historically underserved and women farmers and ranchers are not a special type of loan program or loan type. Rather, this designation refers to a specific funding source known as Socially Disadvantaged Applicant (SDA) funding. To be considered for targeted funding, loan applicants must voluntarily provide race, ethnicity, and gender information.
